Diagnostic Radiology	<p>I.A.2. The program director and, if applicable, the associate/assistant program director(s), must be provided appropriate protected time to fulfill the responsibilities essential in meeting the educational goals of the program. ^(Core)</p> <p>This protected time must total at least:</p> <p>I.A.2.a) 0.4 FTE for programs approved for 16 residents or fewer; ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.2.b) 0.5 FTE for programs approved for 17 to 24 residents; ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.2.c) 0.6 FTE for programs approved for 25 to 32 residents; ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.2.d) 0.7 FTE for programs approved for 33 to 40 residents; and, ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.2.d) 0.8 FTE for programs approved for more than 40 residents. ^(Core)</p> <p>II.B.2.c) The program must designate one physician faculty member to be responsible for the educational content of each of the nine subspecialty areas. This individual must practice at least 50 percent of his or her time in the subspecialty area, and must demonstrate a commitment to the subspecialty. ^(Core)</p>

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Emergency Medicine	<p>I.A.1.b) The sponsoring institution and participating sites must provide salary support or protected time for each associate program director. ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.1.c) The sponsoring institution and participating sites must provide salary support or protected time for all core physician faculty members. ^(Core)</p> <p>I.A.1.c).(1) Core physician faculty members must not be required to generate clinical or other income to support reduced clinical hours. ^(Core)</p> <p>II.A.5.c) APDs must not work clinically more than 24 hours per week on average, or 1152 hours per year, whichever is less. ^(Core)</p> <p>II.B.6.b) Core physician faculty members must not work clinically more than 28 hours per week, or 1344 hours per year, whichever is less. ^(Core)</p>
Emergency Medical Services	<p>I.A.1.b) The sponsoring institution and participating sites must provide at least 15 percent salary support or equivalent protected time for faculty members. ^(Detail)</p> <p>II.B.1.a).(1) These additional core physician faculty members must each devote a minimum of five hours per week of supervision to the fellows. ^(Detail)</p>
Pediatric Emergency Medicine	<p>II.B.5.e).(3) The pediatric emergency medicine faculty must have protected time to allow for teaching and active participation in scholarly activity. ^(Detail)</p>
Family Medicine	<p>II.B.6.a).(1) Core physician faculty members must dedicate at least 60 percent time (at least 24 hours per week, or 1200 hours per year), to the program, exclusive of patient care without residents. ^(Detail)</p> <p>II.B.6.a).(2) Core physician faculty members must devote the majority of their professional effort to teaching, administration, scholarly activity, and patient care within the program. ^(Detail)</p>
Internal Medicine	<p>I.A.2.c) The sponsoring institution and participating sites must provide 20 hours per week salary support for each associate program director required to meet these program requirements. ^(Detail)</p> <p>II.C.1.b).(1) Responsibilities for associate program directors are as follows: must dedicate an average of at least 20 hours per week to the administrative and educational aspects of the educational program, as delegated by the program director, and receive institutional support for this time. ^(Core)</p> <p>II.C.3.b) The core faculty must dedicate an average of at least 15 hours per individual per week throughout the year to residency training. ^(Core)</p>

Molecular Genetic Pathology (subspecialty of Medical Genetics and Genomics or Pathology)	II.B.2.a) The members of the non-physician and physician faculty, including the program director, must, in aggregate, devote at least 20 hours per week to fellowship-related clinical work, teaching, and administration. <i>(Core)</i>
