

Citation Statistics by Academic Year




Total Citations Core 2021 Annual Program Review (N=284)


Total Citations Core 2022 Annual Program Review (N=431)





Total AFIs Core 2022 Annual Program Review (N=374)










Total AFIs Fellowships 2022 Annual Program Review (N=216)



- Increases in resident complement and complement by year and total and must be submitted via ADS with DIO approval
- Permanent Complement Increase requests are reviewed at scheduled RC meetings only.
- Temporary Complement Increase requests are reviewed with other interim requests on a monthly basis.
 - Institutional Operative Data form: can be found on the request form in ADS, will open as an Excel sheet. Needs to be completed for ALL PARTICIPATING SITES listed under program. Tracked Codes report available in ADS or upon request.




