Dr. Oller has developed what we call the 'Meeting of the Milestones.' She instituted having each PGY-1 and PGY-2 learner come to the Clinical Competency Committee for a 10-minute discussion on two of the competencies. For example, the PGY-1 residents come to discuss how they feel they are performing in Medical Knowledge and Patient Care, etc. The feedback received from residents has been resoundingly positive. Dr. Oller has turned this successful endeavor into an excellent workshop that she has presented nationally."
