

## Transfer Criteria for Integrated Programs Review Committee for Plastic Surgery

- 1. Residents may not transfer between independent and integrated formats.
- All transfer requests must be approved by the American Board of Plastic Surgery. The American Osteopathic Board of Surgery (AOBS) does not require pre-approval of transfers into an integrated plastic surgery program for osteopathic residents who intend to take the AOBS certifying examinations.
- 3. If a complement increase is required to accommodate the transfer, a temporary increase request must be entered into the ACGME's Accreditation Data System (ADS) and approved by the Review Committee before the transferring resident can be accepted.
- 4. Transfers into an integrated program are only permitted as follows:
  - Beginning PGY-2: A transfer is permitted after completion of a successful PG-1 year in an ACGME-accredited general surgery, neurological surgery, orthopaedic surgery, otolaryngology, thoracic surgery, urology, or vascular surgery residency, or another ACGME-accredited integrated plastic surgery residency program (Note: **not** applicable to programs with a status of Pre-Accreditation or Continued Pre-Accreditation).
  - Beginning PGY-3: Only residents who have completed at least two progressive years in an ACGME-accredited surgical residency program (as listed in the previous bullet) or in another ACGME-accredited integrated plastic surgery residency program.
  - Beginning PGY-4: Only residents who have successfully completed one of the ACGME-accredited surgical residency programs listed in the first bullet above.
  - Transfers from one integrated plastic surgery program to another are not allowed after the PGY-3 because the last three years of the integrated program must be completed in the same institution.
